All articles offered for competition must be owned by the competitor. Fruits, vegetables and flowers must be grown by the competitor and be the product of the present year, and all manufactured goods must be made by the competitor. Manufactured goods are products made from raw materials.

3. Groom all entries to be free of dirt, disease, spray, and insects.
4. Label varieties with correct name of each entry.
5. Only one entry in each class may be made by exhibitor, but each may enter as many classes as desired.
6. Potted house plants that were entered in previous years cannot be entered again.

## JUDGING:

1. Judges decision will be final. They may give or withhold awards.
2. Only authorized personnel shall remain in the hall during judging. Junior entries will be judged separately.

## GENERAL INFORMATION:

Each entrant is allowed one entry per category, and is limited only by the maximum number of categories in which photos are entered.
Exhibits will be released on Sunday morning from $10 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. to $1 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. If entrants are unable to pick up photographs, they should arrange for someone else to do so.

## PRINT REQUIREMENTS:

The name of the entrant and title of photo shall not appear on the face of the mounted photo, but shall be entered on the reverse side with address to correspond with the entry tag.
All photos must be a minimum of 8 " $\times 10$ " and no larger than 11 "x14". All photos must be mounted on a stiff backing board of 11 "x14". All 8"x10" photos must have an 11 "x14" mat. Photos may be enclosed inside of poly sleeves for protection, but all photos must have hangers attached.

Photos not mounted properly and/or with no hangers will not be accepted.

Photos in conventional frames will not be accepted.
