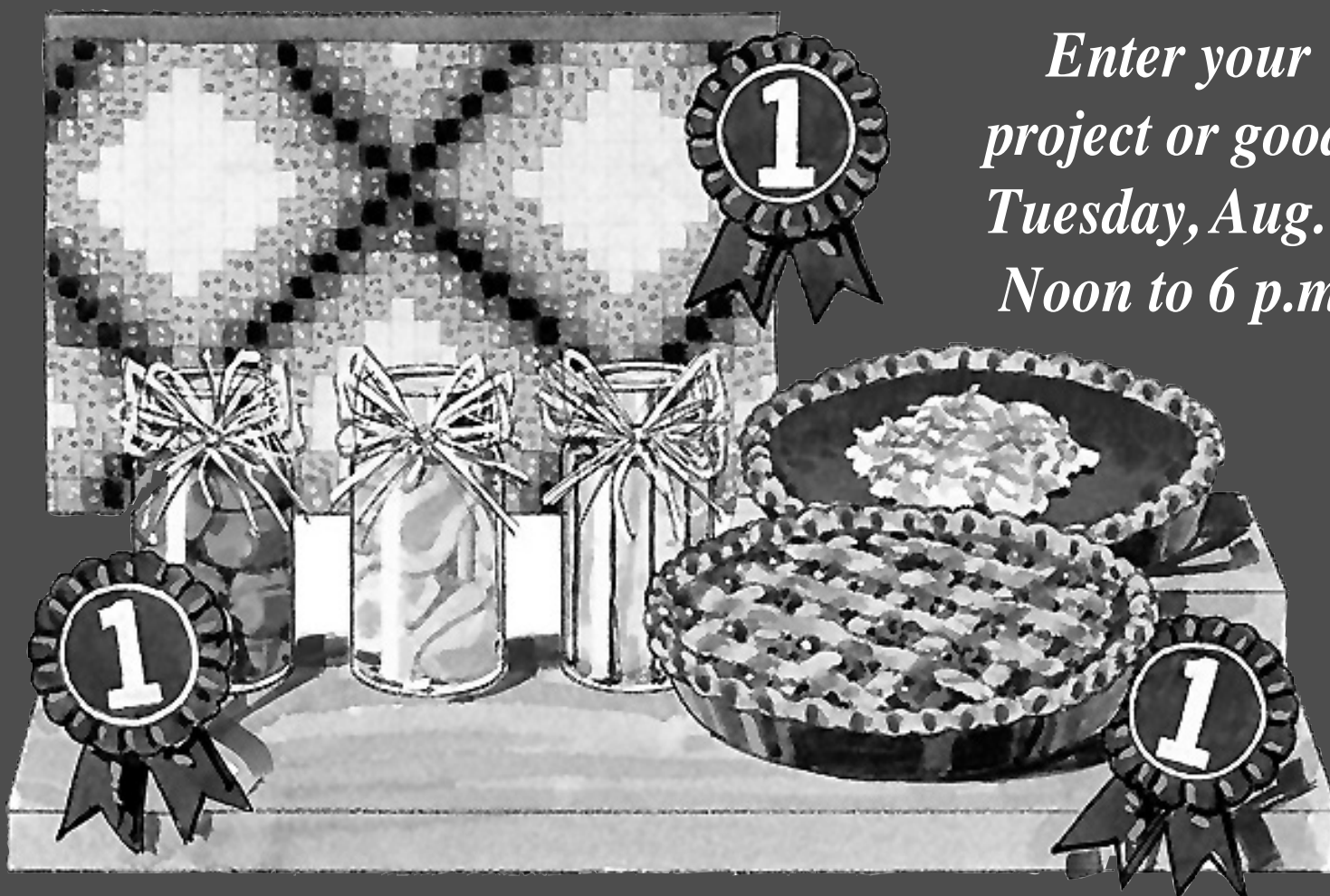

Exhibitors must be Keith County residents. Exhibitors in all Open Class Divisions will be assigned **ONE** number, which will be used in all divisions of Open Class. The exhibitor number will indicate age group. Y - for Youth ages 5-12. T - for teenagers from ages 13-18. A - for Adults ages 19 and over.

All articles offered for competition must be owned by the competitor. Fruits, vegetables and flowers must be grown by the competitor and be the product of the present year, and all manufactured goods must be made by the competitor. Manufactured goods are products made from raw materials.

One item per class will be allowed by exhibitor.

A **Best of Show Award** of \$10 will be given in each of the seven divisions: Agriculture, Horticultural/Floral, Food Products, Textiles, Fine Arts, Photography and Quilts.

*Any other Special recognition award prizes should be claimed within 30 days after the Fair.

RULES:

- All entries in the Horticulture Division MUST be grown by the exhibitor. Display all flowers with self foliage attached. But, no foliage can be below the water line in the vase of cut flowers.
- Containers shall be furnished by exhibitor, in **clear glass bottles, jars or vases.**
- Groom all entries to be free of dirt, disease, spray, and insects.
- Label varieties with correct name of each entry.
- Only one entry in each class may be made by exhibitor, but each may enter as many classes as desired.
- Potted house plants that were entered in previous years cannot be entered again.

JUDGING:

- Judges decision will be final. They may give or withhold awards.
- Only authorized personnel shall remain in the hall during judging. Junior entries will be judged separately.

DIVISION C — FOOD PRODUCTS**RULES**

*All articles must be home made and the product of the exhibitor.

*All products in this department must be canned since the 2022 Fair.

*A person is allowed one entry under one class number.

*All canned fruits and vegetables must be exhibited in clear pint or quart standard glass canning jars and all jelly must be in standard jelly glasses. All jars must be properly covered and sealed with metal lids and rings. Be sure jars are cleaned before entry. Rings should be clean and shiny. **Label each canned product with the method used: hot water bath or pressure canning.**

*Baked goods should be on a paper plate, enclosed in a plastic bag. No fillings, frostings, or glazes are to be used, except on the decorated items. To prevent waste, a portion of the baked item will be displayed. The rest may be picked up by the entrant after judging has finished, Thursday afternoon. Details will be presented on entry day. **Checking out of exhibits will be on Sunday morning 10:00 – 1:00 p.m.**
